



ANNUAL REPORT 1990/1

Administration and Finance

Mrs. Kemp resigned as Clerk in July 1990. Mr. Daybell (Chairman) acted as Clerk until Mrs. Y. Jackson appointed on 1/12/90.

During the year three councillors resigned their posts - Mrs. J. storey and Mr. R.Fletcher in July, being replaced through cooption by Mrs.M.Carver and Mrs.S.Checkley in September, and in October, 1990, Mrs. R. Elliot resigned to be replaced by Mrs. W. Parrett in January 1991.

The Parish Council requested a precept of £2000 for the forthcoming year.

With savings made through the operation of a voluntary Clerk the Parish Council invested in the purchase of an Amstrad Word Processor, which enables the Council to store all its records, letters and accounts, etc. on compact floppy disc.

Planning and Environment

23 Planning Applications have been received in the previous year and been processed by the Parish Council.

Newark Local Plan

The Parish Council delivered a full response to the Local Plan and is pleased to report that a number of recommendations presented by the P.C. have been incorporated into the Final Report, eg. Planning Policies G3 and G4 (Contact Clerk for details)

Tree Planting Scheme

Inspite of the disastrous Summer for our trees, when over two thirds, sadly, died. County Council officers commended the Parish and Village organisations involved in the scheme and are hoping to resupply the Parish in the Autumn. This should also see the commencement of a major planting programme along the new A17 relief road and also the beginning of an environmental improvement scheme on the Harvey Avenue Estate.

A third Parish notice board is to be erected on the Village Green.
